Second Open Source Research (OSR) Workshop in East Asia (September 24 2011, Seoul, South Korea)

'The Open Source Research Workshop' is an annual meeting of East Asian academics and practitioners interested in open source software development. The aim of the annual meeting is to bring together professionals in academia, industry and public administration in East Asia with a shared interest in the open source phenomenon and foster collaboration networks to pursue further related work. The inaugural meeting of Open Source Research in East Asia was held as a workshop session focused on 'Open Source Policy and Promotion of IT Industry in East Asia' in conjunction with the 6th International Conference on Open Source Systems (OSS2010, <http://flossed.org/oss2010>) at Notre Dame, July 2010. Following the success of this workshop, the 'First Open Source Research Workshop in East Asia' was held on November 2010, hosted by Shimane University with attendants from South Korea, Japan, China, and Vietnam. The 'Second Open Source Research Workshop in East Asia' to be held on September 24, 2011, is jointly sponsored by the Korean Society of Management Consulting and Shimane University.
